OVERALL ELIGIBILITY AND CONCESSION CRITERIA

Students may be eligible for a funded course at Stanley College if they have left school, and their primary place of residence is in Western Australia and they are either:

- an Australian citizen OR
- a permanent visa holder OR
- holders of a sub-class 309, 444, 785, 790, or 820 visa;
- secondary holders of a temporary visa of sub-class 457 or 482 visa;
- holders of a Bridging Visa E (subclasses 050 and 051) where the visa holder has made a valid application for a visa of subclass 785 or
- Ukraine citizens who are holders of a visa sub-class 449 or 786;
- Afghan citizens who are holders of a visa sub-class 449; and
- holders of a bridging visa who are eligible to work, and who have made a valid application for a subclass 866.

Concession Eligibility Status ^

The following students are eligible for a concession rate on fees (for training up to Certificate IV level):

- Persons and dependants of persons holding:
 - » a Pensioner Concession Card; OR
 - » a Repatriation Health Benefits Card issued by the Department of Veterans' Affairs; OR
 - » a Health Care Card.
- Persons and dependants of persons in receipt of services from the following Commonwealth support or employment services
 - » Workforce Australia; OR
 - » ParentsNext.
- Persons and dependants of persons in receipt of AUSTUDY or
- Persons and dependants of persons in receipt of the Youth
- Persons and dependants of persons who are inmates of a custodial
- Secondary school-aged persons, not enrolled at school.

Note: Concession rates do not apply to Diploma courses (unless otherwise specified).

FEE WAIVER

Student fees may be waived for applicants with severe financial hardship. For more information, call Stanley College at +618 6371 9999.

Note: All DIPLOMA level courses are NOT eligible for fee waiver.

Eligibility Criteria

Participation — Work Readiness Program (Job Seeker)

To be eligible for the program, students must be unemployed or underemployed* and able to access mainstream training. Students must:

- have a written referral from an Approved Participation Referral Agent for Job Seekers; OR
- be referred by themselves; another agency or recruited by the Service Provider...

*Under employed is an individual working less than 20 hours a week with one or across multiple

FEE-Free Courses Available

Students that enrol through the FEE FREE Program on or before 31 December 2024, are entitled to the fee-free arrangement each year over the entire duration of the course.

Targeted Fee Relief

The annual maximum course fees (cap) for these courses are:

- Concession: \$400 (to be eligible for the course cap, students must have concession status OR be aged 15-24 years old)
- Non-Concession: \$1200
