OVERALL ELIGIBILITY AND CONCESSION CRITERIA

Students may be eligible for a funded course at Stanley College if they have left school, and their primary place of residence is in Western Australia and they are:

- an Australian citizen OR
- a permanent visa holder OR
- holder of visa subclass 309, 444, 785, 790 or 820; OR
- secondary holders of a temporary visa of sub-class 457 or 482 visa; OR
- holders of a Bridging Visa E (subclasses 050 and 051) where the visa holder has made a valid application for a visa of subclass 785 or 790; OR
- Ukraine citizens who are holders of a visa sub-class 449 or 786; OR
- Afghan citizens who are holders of a visa sub-class 449; OR
- holders of a bridging visa who are eligible to work, and who have made a valid application for a subclass 866; AND
- candidates must be unemployed or under-employed

Concession Eligibility Status[^]

The following students are eligible for a concession rate on fees (for training up to Certificate IV level).

- Persons and dependants of persons holding:
 - a Pensioner Concession Card; OR
 - a Repatriation Health Benefits Card issued by the Department of Veterans' Affairs; OR
 - a Health Care Card.
- Persons and dependants of persons in receipt of services from the following Commonwealth support or employment services programs:
 - Workforce Australia; OR
 - ParentsNext.
- Persons and dependants of persons in receipt of AUSTUDY or ABSTUDY.
- Persons and dependants of persons in receipt of the Youth Allowance.
- Persons and dependants of persons who are inmates of a custodial institution.
- Secondary school-aged persons, not enrolled at school.

Notes:

- Concession rates do not apply to Culturally and Linguistically Diverse (CALD) courses or Diploma and Advanced Diploma courses (unless otherwise specified).

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Participation - Equity Program

The Culturally and Linguistically Diverse (CALD) target group are Students who are:

- unemployed and have a written referral from an Approved Participation Referral Agent for the CALD cohort; or
- unemployed and, if self-referred or referred by another agency or recruited by the Service Provider, they must not be of:
 - Anglo-Saxon*, Anglo-Celtic*, or Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander ancestry; and
 - Must have documentation that may include but is not limited to humanitarian visas, passports or travel documents or birth certificates or other documentation showing they were born in countries defined as CALD

* Anglo-Saxon and Anglo-Celtic includes people whose ancestry is from a main English speaking country including England, Scotland, Wales, Ireland, Canada, South Africa, and the United States of America

Participation – Work Readiness Program (Job Seeker)

To be eligible for the program, students must be unemployed or under-employed* and able to access mainstream training. Students must:

- have a written referral from an Approved Participation Referral Agent for Job Seekers; OR
- be referred by themselves; another agency or recruited by the Service Provider.

*Under employed is an individual working less than 20 hours a week with one or across multiple employers.
