

OVERALL ELIGIBILITY

Students may be eligible for a funded course at Stanley College if they have left school, and their primary place of residence is in Western Australia and they are either:

- an Australian citizen OR
- a permanent visa holder OR
- holders of a sub-class 300, 309, 444, 445, 461, 785, 790, or 820
- secondary holders of a temporary visa of sub-class 188, 457, 482, 489, 491 or 494 visa:
- holders of a Bridging Visa E (subclasses 050 and 051) where the visa holder has made a valid application for a visa of subclass 785 or
- Ukraine citizens who are holders of a visa sub-class 449 or 786;
- Afghan citizens who are holders of a visa sub-class 449; and
- holders of a bridging visa who are eligible to work, and who have made a valid application for a visa of subclass 866.

Eligibility Criteria

Participation — Work Readiness Program (Job Seeker)

To be eligible for the program, students must be unemployed or underemployed* and able to access mainstream training. Students must:

- have a written referral from a Participation Referral Agent for Job
- be referred by themselves; another agency or recruited by the Service Provider.

FEE-Free Courses Available

Students that enrol through the FEE FREE Program on or before 31 December 2025, are entitled to the fee-free arrangement each year over the entire duration of the course.
