It combines theoretical learning with practical experience, preparing graduates to provide high-quality care to patients under the supervision of Registered Nurses or other healthcare professionals.

The Australian Nursing and Midwifery Accreditation Council (ANMAC) has granted accreditation to Stanley College for its HLT54121 Diploma of Nursing course. The [Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia](#) has approved the program as providing a qualification for the purposes of registration as an enrolled nurse.

<b>Basic Computer Literacy</b>	Stanley College requires that students for this course have 'basic computer literacy' which covers the most common usages of a computer, including: managing computer files, word processing, using spreadsheets and databases; creating presentations; finding information and communicating using computers; and being aware of social and ethical implications of Internet use

### Course Pre-Requisite Requirements

- Applicants must be at least 18 years old at the time of course commencement
- Successful completion of the language, literacy, and numeracy (LLN) test and demonstration of competence level as exit level 3
- Completion of a Pre-Enrolment Interview

### Academic Entry Requirements

- Completion of Australian Year 12 or equivalent; OR
- Completion of a Certificate IV level or higher qualification or equivalent

### English Proficiency Entry Requirements

Applicants must meet the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia (NMBA) English Language Registration Standard#:

- Primary Language Pathway - Complete a declaration to declare English as their primary language; OR
- English Language Test Pathway\* - Provide test result reports for one of the following tests taken within the 2 years prior to completing an application:
  - ELTS Academic: Overall score of at least 7.0 with no band less than 7.0
  - PTE Academic: Overall score of at least 65 with no individual skill below 65
  - OET: At least B Grade in all components
  - TOEFL iBT: Minimum total score of 94, with minimum score of 24 for listening, 24 for reading, 27 for writing and 23 for speaking

## A Career in Nursing
