

English Language Assessment Policy (VET)

1. Purpose

1.1 This policy provides a framework for Stanley College's English language assessment for admission into VET courses.

2. Scope

2.1 This policy applies to all students of Stanley College, as well as staff involved in the assessment of English language capability.

3. Responsibility

3.1 The Admissions Manager is responsible for the monitoring and oversight of the English language assessment processes.

4. Definitions

AQF	The Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) is the national policy for regulated qualifications in Australian education and training. It incorporates the qualifications from each education and training sector into a single comprehensive national qualifications framework.
Cambridge English (CAE)	Cambridge English: Advanced (CAE), also known as the Certificate in Advanced English (CAE), is an international English language examination developed by Cambridge English Language Assessment (previously known as University of Cambridge ESOL Examinations).
Common European	The Common European Framework of Reference for Languages

5. Policy Provisions

Principles

- 5.1 English language entry requirements into VET courses at Stanley College are:
 - 5.1.1 clearly indicated in Stanley College's admission information and on the College's website;
 - 5.1.2 at a standard as expected of a course set at the appropriate AQF level; and
 - 5.1.3 benchmarked against other VET institutions offering similar courses.
- 5.2 All students, whether domestic or international, must provide evidence that their English language ability meets the minimum requirements for admission into a course.
- 5.3 Stanley College reserves the right to request that a student undergoes an English test in addition to any other evidence of English proficiency provided.
- 5.4 A review is to be undertaken by Stanley College every three years to ensure the English language proficiency standards for admission are sufficient. This review will be undertaken by the Vice President Business Development for reporting to the Academic Board.

English Language Requirements for VET Courses (Domestic Students)

- 5.5 Students may be deemed to have satisfied the College's English language requirements if they can provide evidence they meet one of the following principles:
 - 5.5.1 an English Language pass level in an Australian Senior Certificate of Education (Year 12) or equivalent;
 - 5.5.2 satisfactory completion of an accredited Australian qualification equivalent to AQF Level 5 or above;

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- 5.5.3 satisfactory completion of an accredited tertiary award in English; or
- 5.5.4 the student has undertaken an acceptable English language test.
- 5.6 Where a student is required to provide a statement or certificate to demonstrate English language proficiency, the documentation must:
 - 5.6.1 be an original scanned copy; and
 - 5.6.2 be accompanied by a certified translation if the qualification is not in English.

English Language Requirements for VET Courses (International Students)

- 5.7 The minimum standards of achievement in English language tests approved for VET study at Stanley College are:
 - 5.7.1 Certificate II IV: IELTS 5 or equivalent
 - 5.7.2 Diploma or Advanced Diploma: IELTS 5.5 or equivalent
 - 5.7.3 HLT54121 Diploma of Nursing: IELTS 7.0 with no band less than 7.0 in listening, reading, and speaking, and a minimum score of 6.5 in writing or equivalent
 - 5.7.4 Graduate Certificate or Graduate Diploma: IELTS 6.0 or equivalent
- 5.8 To ensure adequate English language ability, students must meet the following language proficiency requirements for Certificate II, Certificate III and Certificate IV courses:

5.12 To ensure adequate English language ability, students must meet the following language proficiency requirements for Graduate Certificate or Graduate Diploma courses:

5.13 Students are eligible to get an exemption from English proficiency, if a student has competed a Certificate IV level qualification or higher qualification in Australia (award should be no more than 10 years old, conditions apply). This exemption does not apply to the HLT54121 Diploma of Nursing, where applicants are required to meet the English Language Registration Standard as prescribed above.

Conditional Offers

- 5.14 Stanley College reserves the right to make any offer conditional on meeting English language requirements if the student fails to demonstrate their English language ability is sufficient.
- 5.15 This conditional offer means that the student is not permitted to be accepted in the course until English language proficiency is reassessed once further evidence of proficiency has been provided by the student.
- 5.16 A full offer will only be issued once English language proficiency requirements have been met.
